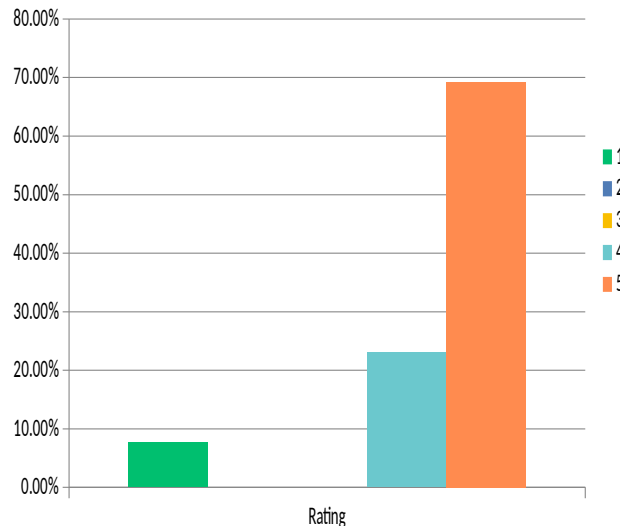


Teaching Evaluations in for the classes in Microeconomics (1st year MPhil course) Teacher: Ole Jann
